

Advocate Christ Family Medicine Inpatient/Outpatient Elective

The Advocate Christ Family Medicine Residency Program is excited to extend an inpatient or outpatient sub-internship elective invitation to students with an interest in pursuing Family Medicine Primary Care.

The outpatient elective is a 4-week rotation with our full-spectrum residency program site training resident physicians who serve their patients and community with evidence-based medicine via a holistic and family-centered approach. Students will be supervised by a family medicine faculty member or resident. This elective is an excellent chance to experience full-spectrum ambulatory Family Medicine.

The inpatient elective is a 4-week rotation with the family medicine inpatient service team. The student will be supervised by a family medicine faculty member and residents. There is no family medicine ambulatory experience during this rotation.

1. **Statement including:**
 - a. **What you hope to gain from your elective in Family Medicine**
 - b. **Aspects of Family Medicine you would like to experience during your inpatient or outpatient rotation**
 - c. **Specialty you plan to apply to**
2. **COMLEX or USMLE scores**

Request are accepted starting **March 1st** and rotations are filled on a rolling basis.

Inpatient Electives are available for **4 weeks-blocks August through April**, one rotator per block.

Outpatient Electives are available for **4-weeks blocks August through January**, two rotators per block.

ROTATION OBJECTIVES:

1. Prioritize a differential diagnosis following a clinical encounter
2. Recommend and interpret common diagnostic and screening tests
3. Enter and discuss orders and prescriptions
4. Formulate clinical questions and retrieve evidence to advance patient care
5. Collaborate as a member of an interprofessional team
6. Recognize a patient requiring urgent or emergent care and initiate evaluation and management
7. Reflect on and describe the role of the family physician within the greater healthcare system and interprofessional/intraprofessional specialty team

EVALUATION METHODS:

1. Daily on-the-fly feedback with supervising residents/attendings
2. Mid-rotation feedback with the course director
3. End of rotation feedback with the course director
4. Student evaluation of the rotation:
 - a. Informal verbal feedback throughout the rotation
 - b. Formal written feedback at the conclusion of the rotation
