**Rotations will be cancelled if forms and information are not complete and approved a minimum of six (6) weeks prior to the start of the rotation.**

Family Medicine is a four-week elective, offered to Medical Students from Affiliated and Non-Affiliated Medical Schools.

- We do not accept applications from students of International or Caribbean schools.
- Students must be from an LCME or AOA accredited medical school.

**Rotation Description:**

This is a four-week inpatient experience. Students are expected to function at the sub-intern level. Students will participate as members of the Family Medicine Inpatient Team consisting of three junior Family Medicine residents, two senior Family Medicine residents, and a Family Medicine attending. The student will have supervised responsibility for patient care, including histories and physical, creating a treatment plan, and following up. Students will participate in morning report, article rounds, and teaching rounds.

**Rotation Objectives:**

Patient care:

- The student will conduct (under supervision) a relevant history and physical exam for newly admitted inpatients and write a comprehensive H and P.
- The student will conduct (under supervision) daily rounds for each of his/her patients and write daily progress notes.

Systems-based practice:

- The student will effectively use the electronic health record.
- When necessary, the student will appropriately recommend consultation from specialty services, with an informed knowledge of the specialty's scope of practice and potential involvement in the patient's care.
- When necessary, the student will appropriately recommend imaging or special studies, with an informed knowledge of tests' risks, benefits, and costs.

**Professionalism:**

- The student will be punctual, available and accept assignments willingly.
- The student will demonstrate efficient patient care, as appropriate for their level of training.

**Practice-Based Learning; Medical Knowledge:**

- The student will identify one area of knowledge deficit pertinent to a patient they are caring for. The student will research this area of deficiency and prepare a short talk (10 minutes) to inform the rest of the team about this area.

**Interpersonal Skills and Communication:**

- The student will work as an effective member of the Family Medicine inpatient team.

**Things to Know:**

- Students are required to bring their school ID badge. This **MUST** be worn above the waist and visible along with your hospital-issued access card.
- Parking is available for \$10.00 per week with 24-hour access.
- Bring ***and wear*** a short student lab coat.
- Scheduled absences require prior approval by Site Preceptor before beginning of rotation.
- Any unplanned absences must be reported to Student Coordinator via email.
- Students are required to attend Family Medicine Conferences every Friday at 8:30am. Time/Location is subject to change. Schedule emailed to you by Site Coordinator will have the most current information.
- In-house call is about six times during your rotation from 5pm to 8pm.
- Medical Education is responsible for onboarding of medical students. All documentation is submitted through MedHub.
