**Emergency Number 83-5555**

<b>Code Red</b>	<b>FIRE</b>	<p>R Rescue anyone out of immediate danger</p> <p>A Activate the Fire Alarm</p> <p>C Contain the Fire</p> <p>E Extinguish the Fire</p>
<b>Code Blue</b>	<b>MEDICAL EMERGENCY</b>	Code Blue Responders Respond. Perform treatment if trained.
<b>Code Silver</b>	<b>ACTIVE SHOOTER ARMED INTRUDER</b>	<p>EVACUATE Evacuate from immediate danger.</p> <p>HIDE OUT Hide in a secure room.</p> <p>TAKE ACTION Defend yourself as last resort.</p>
<b>Code Pink</b>	<b>INFANT-CHILD ABDUCTION</b>	Monitor all exits and corridors near department.
<b>Code White</b>	<b>COMBATIVE INDIVIDUAL</b>	Keep yourself safe and wait for Public Safety.
<b>Code Green</b>	<b>UTILITY FAILURE</b>	For power failure ensure all essential equipment is plugged into Red outlets. Other failures, follow directions per policy.
<b>Code Purple</b>	<b>EVACUATION</b>	Await further directions. If emergent, evacuate Horizontal or Vertical.
<b>Code Orange</b>	<b>EXTERNAL HAZARDOUS MATERIALS</b>	Decontamination Team responds to the Emergency Department.
<b>Code Black</b>	<b>TORNADO WARNING</b>	Close all corridor, fire/smoke doors. Clinical areas move patients to corridors. Ambulatory patients/visitors to corridors or interior room.
<b>Tornado Watch</b>	<b>TORNADO WATCH</b>	Think of actions to be taken/precautions if a Code Black Tornado Warning is announced. PCC's to print current Census in their departments.
<b>Code Zodiac</b>	<b>BOMB THREAT</b>	If receive Bomb Threat, call 83-5555. Quick search of area for suspicious objects.
<b>Code Triage</b>	<b>MASS CASUALTY</b>	Designated departments respond to ED or labor pool as directed by policy.
<b>Code MTP</b>	<b>MASS TRANSFUSION PROTOCOL</b>	Designated departments respond to announced department.
<b>Code Trauma Level 1</b>	<b>LEVEL 1 TRAUMA PATIENT</b>	Designated departments respond to announced ED room.

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<b>Code Cardiac</b>	<b>HEART ATTACK STEMI</b>	Designated Code Cardiac Team responds
<b>Stroke Alert</b>	<b>STROKE</b>	Designated Stroke Alert Team responds
<b>Code OB</b>	<b>OB EMERGENT SITUATION</b>	Code OB Rapid Response Team responds
<b>Code R</b>	<b>IMMEDIATE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE</b>	Code R Response Team responds
<b>Code H</b>	<b>CARE CONCERNS</b>	Rapid Response Team responds Unit Leadership and Service Excellence responds
<b>HIS Status</b>	<b>UNEXPECTED IS DOWNTIME</b>	<u>Status 0</u> – system available but in degraded state. <u>Status 1</u> – System is expected to be down less than 1 hour. <u>Status 2</u> – System is expected to be down for 1-2 hours. <u>Status 3</u> – System is expected to be down for 2-4 hours. <u>Status 4</u> – System expected to be down longer than 4 hours. <u>Status All Clear</u> – System is functioning normally
